She was a school teacher for Goldston and Ashtola schools, worked as a bookkeeper for the gin, and was a banker at the Farmer's State Bank. She was a member of the 1926 Book Club and was also a member of The Circle at the First United Methodist Church. Mrs. Graham taught Sunday School and was a faithful worker for her church. She was a lifelong resident of Donley Co. and was a member of the First United Methodist Church in Clarendon.
