Arrangements are by Robertson Funeral Directors of Clarendon. Curly was born in Melrose, New Mexico, on May 30, 1931 to Roy and Nellie Pierce Monroe. He married Hazel Hanegan 63 years ago on May 13, 1950 in Clovis, New Mexico. Curly served 12 years in the United States Navy CB Reserves. He lived 43 years in Clarendon where he was an engineer for the Texas Department of Transportation. After his retirement from Tx Dot, he and his three sons formed a partnership, Monroe and Sons, where they contracted with the State of Texas to build bridges, overpasses, and culverts for 12 years. He finished his highway career working for Slaco, Inc., Gilvin-Terrill Inc., Amarillo Roads, and J. Lee Milligan Inc. He loved to sum up his career by saying that he built roads all across Texas. He enjoyed traveling, reading, and going to casinos. He was a loving husband and father. He was known as "Papa Curly" to his grandkids and great-grandkids.
