In lieu of flowers the family asks that donations be sent to a charity of your choosing.

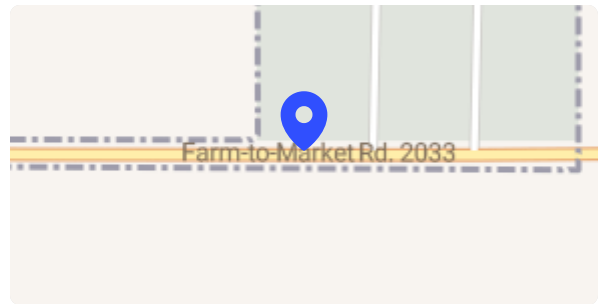

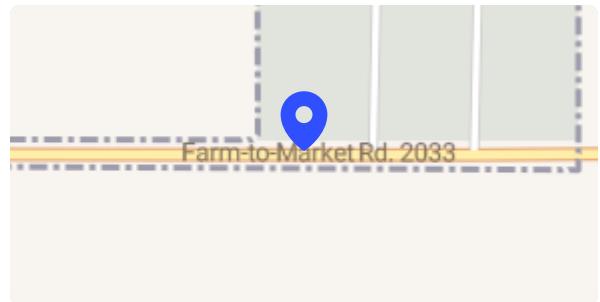
