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Jack Wardlow, 88, of Shamrock passed away Wednesday, August 11, 2021 in Shamrock.

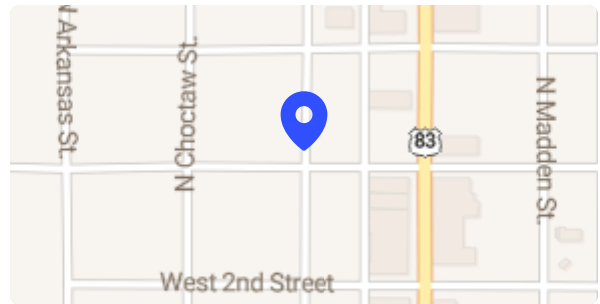

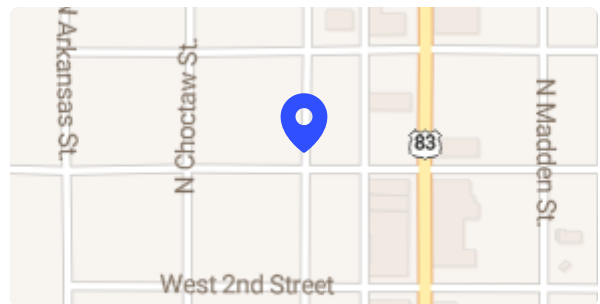

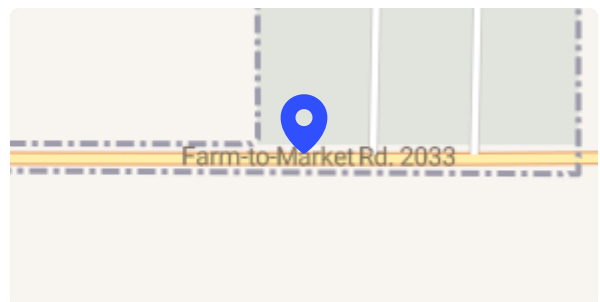
